❖ Our Church Plan for New Health Guidelines

Due to Governor Inslee's new restrictions on in-person gatherings for religious services that was released on Sunday, November 15, and is effective from 11:59 PM, Monday, November 16, through Monday, December 14, we encourage everyone to do their part in stopping the spread of COVID-19.
